# Phase 1

Unless otherwise noted, Phase 1 is effective beginning May 1.

#### **City ordinance**

Employers, businesses and community members should continue to implement social distancing at all times. Retail establishments should continue providing protective measures for employees and members of the public.

Businesses must clearly post occupancy limits on all entrances and exits.

Wearing a cloth or procedure mask is recommended, but not mandatory, in the following circumstances:

- All employees of the following business types should wear masks at all times while inside the facility:
  - · Restaurants and bars
  - Retail stores
  - Personal care stores (salons, spas, massage therapists, etc.)
  - · Gyms, exercise facilities, and indoor sports facilities
  - Entertainment venues (movie theaters, arcades, live theaters, etc.)
  - Daycare or childcare facilities
- · All customers of the following business types should wear masks while waiting to enter or while inside at all times:
  - Retail stores
  - Entertainment venues (movie, theaters, arcades, live theaters, etc.)

# OURS plan

#### **Effective April 24**

- Personal care businesses, such as hair salons, barbershops, spas, nail salons, and pet groomers can reopen for appointments only, must adhere to sanitation protocols, and follow guidelines regarding social distancing between customers and visitors at personal care businesses.
- Grocery stores should continue to maintain hours for vulnerable populations
- Retail and other essential businesses are open and may operate per the Governor's Executive Order.

#### Effective May 1

- Dining, entertainment, movie theatres and sporting venues can operate using CDC-recommended social distancing and sanitation protocols.
- Gyms may reopen if they adhere to CDC-recommended social distancing and sanitation protocols
- Places of worship can reopen for in-person meetings or worship if they leave every other row or pew open and adhere to CDC-recommended social distancing and sanitation protocols, plus the recommended guidelines from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.
- Bars should remain closed.
- Tattoo Parlors can reopen for appointments only and must adhere to sanitation protocols and social distancing protocols for distancing between customers and visitors.

#### Specific Employer guidance:

- · Schools and organized sporting events and camps that are currently closed should remain closed until further notice
- Visits to Senior Living Facilities and Hospitals are prohibited

# Phase 2

To be implemented once hospital and incident rates remain at a manageable level for 14 more days as determined by the State.

#### City ordinance

Begin phased reopening of City facilities and services

### OURS plan

- Visits to senior care facilities and hospitals should still be prohibited
- Bars can operate with diminished standing-room occupancy, where applicable and appropriate, and under social distancing and sanitation protocols
- Funerals and weddings can resume under social distancing protocols
- Children's nursery areas in places of worship can reopen

# Specific Employer guidance:

 Organized sports activities can reopen and operate under proper social distancing and sanitation protocols

## Phase 3

To be implemented once hospital and incident rates remain at a manageable level for 14 more days as determined by the State.

#### City ordinance

- Resume utility cut-offs for non-payment
- Offer extended payment arrangements for up to one year for utility customers who have past due balances that were incurred during the terms of the City's emergency measures
- Resume City meetings held under Senate Bill 661 if not already revoked by the State
- Discontinue 25 percent utility discount for businesses impacted during the emergency period
- Discontinue Covid-19 Emergency Advisory Board
