Mayor Copeland welcomed members of Scout Troop #1 who were in attendance to earn their Citizenship in Community Badge.

Mayor Copeland also read the Black History Month Proclamation and presented it to Lorront Carney, Executive Director of the Westside Community Center.

Mr. Carney then proceeded to recognize City Employee Beverly Robinson as the first African American to work for the Bartlesville Fire Department, and to her son, Broderick Guise as the first African American to be promoted to Captain in the Bartlesville Fire Department. Fire Chief John Banks presented Captain Guise with his Captain pin and spoke highly of Captain Guise and his family. Congratulations were shared by all of the City Council, and by many firefighters, friends and family attending the meeting.

8. Discuss and take possible action to approve a Sponsorship Agreement between the City of Bartlesville and ConocoPhillips Company. Presented by Jess Kane, City Attorney.

Prior to discussion, Mr. Stuart recused himself due to his employment with ConocoPhillips.

Mr. Kane reported that ConocoPhillips provided \$100,000 to the Tower Center at Unity Square Project. The Sponsorship Agreement states the ConocoPhillips will be the exclusive sponsor of all of the lawn areas and adjacent gather spaces within the project, as well having exclusive naming rights for any street or public thoroughfare that is identified, constructed or otherwise opened that is connected with or adjacent to the venue. Vice Mayor Gentges added that ConocoPhillips will also be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with any third-party services used in the development and expense of any monument signage exclusive to ConocoPhillips, above and beyond the \$100,000. Mr. Curd added his appreciation to ConocoPhillips.

9. Discuss and take possible action on the award of Bid No. 2019-2020-019 for the Water Utilities Building Renovation. Presented by Vice Mayor Gentges.

Vice Mayor Gentges with the assistance of Mr. Lauritsen presented the bid.

10. Discuss and take possible action to declare Lot 3-J in the subdivision known as a Replat of Lot 3, Woodland Park 28th Addition to the City of Bartlesville, Washington County, State of Oklahoma as Surplus Property. Presented by Jess Kane, City Attorney.

Mr. Kane reported that City staff has negotiated an agreement for sale of a vacant lot adjacent to Civitan Park to Garret Parr for \$35,000.00. In order to enter into an Agreement for Sale of Real Estate with the prospective buyer, the property must be declared surplus.

11. Discuss and take possible action to approve proposed Agreement for Sale of Real Estate between the City of Bartlesville ("City") and Garret Parr ("Parr") for Lot 3-J in the subdivision known as a Replat of Lot 3, Woodland Park 28th Addition to the City of Bartlesville, Washington County, State of Oklahoma. Presented by Jess Kane, City Attorney.

Mr. Kane reported that City Staff has negotiated an agreement for sale of a vacant lot adjacent to Civitan Park to Garret Parr for \$35,000.00. This agreement calls for conveyance of the property by Warranty Deed. Since the buyer requested conveyance of the property by Warranty Deed, it was necessary to go through the process of updating the abstract and having it reviewed by an attorney prior to closing. Staff recommends approval of the proposed Agreement for Sale of Real estate. Vice Mayor Gentges inquired as to what Mr. Parr was planning for property. Mr. Parr came forward and announced he would be building and operating an Edward Jones Financial Services office.

Further discussion covered the value of the property; that \$35,000 is over the amount of the land's value; and since the transaction was over the amount the City Charter allows the City Manager to approve, the City Council must approve the sale.

Mr. Kane reported that he has served as City Prosecutor since January 2014 at the rate of \$600 per month. He serves as both City Prosecutor and City Attorney since January 1, 2019 without additional compensation for his services as City Prosecutor. Due to the workload associated with both positions, staff recommends that Cana B. Mize be retained as an independent contractor to serve as City Prosecutor at the rate of \$600 per month.

13. Discuss and take possible action to approve proposed Release of Oil and Gas Lease. Presented by Jess Kane, City Attorney.

Mr. Kane reported that on February 1, 1989, Lena Keefer deeded the SW/4 of Section 14, Township 26 North, Range 13 East, Washington County, Oklahoma to the City of Bartlesville to create the Bartlesville Industrial Park. At that time, the property was burdened by an active oil and gas lease. The operator of the lease assigned its interest in the lease to the City of Bartlesville as to said SW/4. Even though the lease has not been active for over 30 years, it is still reflected as an oil and gas lease in the Washington County land records and will constitute a cloud on ABB's title to the property. The leasehold interest has no value to the City and has expired under Oklahoma law due to its inability to produce oil or gas in paying quantities. Therefore, staff requests release of the lease in order to clear the title to the property for ABB. Mr. Kane further explained the Habendum Clause which defines the primary term and secondary term of the lease.

14. Discuss and take action to approve an Ordinance of the Council of the City of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, authorizing the calling and holding of a special election in the City of Bartlesville, State of Oklahoma (the "City"), on the 7th day of April, 2020, for the purpose of submitting to the registered qualified electors of said City the question of the issuance of General Obligation Bonds of said City in an amount not to exceed the sum of Sixteen Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$16,400,000) to be issued in series to provide funds for the purposes of: (i) acquiring, constructing, expanding, renovating, repairing, and/or equipping public safety buildings, facilities, and equipment, all to be owned exclusively by the City, (ii) acquiring, constructing, expanding, renovating, repairing, and/or equipping municipal buildings, facilities, and equipment, all to be owned exclusively by the City; (iii) constructing, reconstructing, repairing, improving, and rehabilitating existing streets, roads, bridges, and intersections in the city (including lighting, sidewalks/bikepaths, landscaping, related drainage improvements, driveway reconstruction, and other related improvements); and (iv) constructing, expanding, repairing, which may also include improving, renovating, acquiring and equipping parks and recreational facilities, all to be owned exclusively by the City; all to be completed with or without the use of other funds, and levying and collecting an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City for the payment of the interest and principal on said Bonds; providing for election procedures; authorizing professional services agreements pertaining to the issuance of said Bonds; declaring an emergency; and containing other provisions related thereto. Presented by Nate Ellis, The Public Finance Law Group PLLC.

Mr. Ellis reported that this action approves the next series of General Obligation Bonds, the projects and how this will keep the mil levy at 15. He further explained how a few of the projects were reorganized from the list he was provided by City staff, and how the propositions are set out in the ordinance. He concluded that the deadline to call the election is Thursday, February 7, 2020 in order for the election to be held April 7, 2020.

15. Discuss and take action to approve an Ordinance extending the levy of a one-half of one percent sales tax which tax is currently levied and authorized by Ordinance 2716 and extended by Ordinance 2784, Ordinance 3001, Ordinance 3097, Ordinance 3264, and Ordinance 3404, in addition to all other State, County and City sales taxes upon the gross proceeds or gross receipts derived from all sales to any person taxable under the sales tax law of Oklahoma including but not limited to certain enumerated sales listed therein; providing for subsisting state permits; providing for the purpose of the tax and earmarking the same; providing for effective date and duration of said tax; incorporating certain provisions of prior City Ordinances; authorizing City Council to make administrative and technical changes and additions; making the tax cumulative; providing severability of provisions; requiring approval this ordinance by a majority of registered qualified electors voting at an election held for such purpose as provided by law; and containing other provisions related thereto. Presented by Nate Ellis, The Public Finance Law Group PLLC.

Mr. Ellis reported that this action will continue an existing sales tax that does not expire until June 2021. The approval by voters will allow this extension to immediately go into effect once the previous extension expires.

Vice Mayor Gentges commented on how the Tower Center at Unity Square project is coming along despite the rainy weather. The call for artists for design of the water feature is now being considered by the committees.

Mr. Stuart commented on his ride-along with Fire Captain Guise the past weekend. Mayor Copeland again congratulated Captain Guise on his recognition this evening. Mr. Bailey concurred adding that the recognition was a long-time coming.

Mayor Copeland commented on the good job the City staff does and how they should not be taken for granted. There will be a snow event Tuesday evening, and Mr. Bailey reported that our Public Works Department is ready to sand the streets if needed.
